"Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water." "Come," he said. Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus.

There's this old quote that says, "A boat in port is safe, but that is not what boats were built for." Imagine what the disciples must have felt. The seas were high. The lightning highlighted the whitecaps as they crested over the edges of the boat. The disciples were all alone. In the distance, a shadow, a figure, began to emerge. At first they were scared. Then they recognized that it was Jesus, walking to them on the water.
